ASPIRATIONAL VALUES

On Wednesday nights over the past couple of months we have been talking about the future at WHBC. We began our discussion with some new concepts, language and perspectives such as the digital front door, experimental gospel communities and much more. We spent some time talking about the history of the church and the many ministry opportunities which bore fruit in the past. We highlighted a glorious past and reminisced about the ministry which brought much joy to our lives.

We then turned our attention to some present realities that don't match the glorious past and which we would all like to see returned to kingdom fruitfulness. We asked and answered some tough questions about our present and the potential realities if those issues are not addressed and changed. It has become increasingly clear that the pain of adjusting/changing some of aspects of the current ministry is lesser than the pain of potential future realities if we don't. We have all come to realize that where we are and what we are doing is not quite the realization of God's best for us.

From there we began to discuss the core values at WHBC; those values that permeate who we are and all that we do. We came to a consensus that Biblically Focused, Family Centric and Mission Minded represented those core values. Biblically focused was defined as intentionally knowing and obeying the Bible. Family Centric was defined as having a deep care for our family of faith. Mission Minded was defined as having a mind to support Gospel missions. We then asked if those values matched what we believed God wanted of us and the consensus was that they did not in whole.

That led us to begin to identify some "aspirational values." Those are goals we believe God has called us to strive for in the immediate future and which would then become our core values. These values/goals are healthy adaptations of our current core values. The first is Learning, Living and Proclaiming God's Word. The second is Equipping Families to Reach Families. The third is Every Member on Mission for God. We believe that these values represent the future of WHBC and that we have some work to do in order to reach those goals. Our hope is that every member of WHBC would commit to helping us reach these God-sized goals by praying and working to make them our reality.

Many thanks are in order! We know it has been a long year and our patience has been tested at every turn. As such, the added measure of grace you have extended to the Pastor Search Committee the past twelve months has been so greatly appreciated. When COVID-19 drastically changed how organizations operated for the past year, we experienced many of the same hurdles. Meeting as a group larger than 10 became difficult and having a genuine opportunity to get to know potential pastoral candidates became challenging.

Your Pastor Search Committee was thrilled to be able to get back together in person this past month and reassess where we were in our process and what had transpired over the past year. We know the landscape of our country has changed because of this past year's experiences with the Coronavirus. It seems the pastoral candidate landscape was equally changed. Through some diligent research we have come to better understand some of the challenges COVID-19 posed for pastors. Studies showed that many pastors grew weary of the added burden of technology and social distancing and felt the Lord was calling them to an earlier retirement while others were forced to leave the ministry for alternative employment when churches lost significant income or closed their doors. Still others thrived in this new environment and saw new ministry opportunities begin because of the pandemic.

Ultimately, as a group, we determined to cast the net once again to see what changes had occurred in our original pool of candidates and to see what new candidates had arisen in the past year. We are steadily receiving new resumes and look forward with great anticipation to reviewing these resumes and fulfilling the roll you have called us to. Once again, thank you for your patience and your prayers. We are positive that God has been moving in a mighty way this past year and that He is faithful and sovereign in all things, especially this pastor search process. He has a candidate in store for us!
