### NEW THINGS ARE HAPPENING FROM OUR CHURCH SERCURITY TEAM: ELECTRONIC SECURITY SYSTEMS

Church Family, we want to share with you that we received a grant to purchase a card access system for the exterior doors of the church.

We felt this was a need since there are many keys out there that have been lost or not turned in when someone no longer is a member of our church. This will allow us the ability to track and oversee those with access to the church.

The installation is now complete and there will be a transition period to get those that need access a card or FOB, before we switch over to the new system and re-key the locks.

We will work with the church office now through October in setting up times for individuals to swap out their keys for the card or FOB. We are asking for a \$10. deposit to help cover the cost in the event something should happen to your card.

Did you know, There are many ways to give your tithes and offerings to our church?

You can still give by putting your offering in an envelope and put it in the offering basket while you are here at church.

- But what if you are not here, or forgot your checkbook or offering at home and you still want to give?
- 1) You can give at our Giving Kiosk that is mounted to the wall outside of the Sanctuary by just a swipe of your debit or credit card.
- 2) You can download the **SecureGive** app on your smartphone and give with a debit or credit card.
- 3) You can go online to your own bank's website and set up a payment to the church, just like you would pay a utility bill. This can even be set up to be done on a reoccurring basis so your offerings will always be received on time even if you are not here. And generally there is no charge for this service to you or the church.
- 4) You can go to our church website (www.whbcnow.org) and click the **SecureGive link** and give with a debit or credit card. This can also be setup on a reoccurring basis.

5You could mail your check to the church. It will take a few days to get here and you will need a postage stamp.

You can be sure your tithe and offerings are not missed by giving through one of these other ways.


