Don't we serve an amazing God? Certainly we could not have imagined, twelve months ago, what this past year would hold. But, oh the God who has held each of us in His hands this past year! We could not have imagined the fear and death that would ravage our world. But, oh the God who calms all fear and conquered death and the grave! Never could we have imagined the overwhelming change to our daily lives. But, oh the God who never changes!

Friends, if you could somehow bottle up, catalogue or encapsulate this past year into some digestible description, with all its difficulty and loss, the sheer magnitude of that hopelessness is nothing. Because prayer isn't just something we talk about doing, but something that West Hampton makes a priority, we have not forgone the opportunity to come together and collectively make our requests known to God, interceding on behalf of those who need His provision.

As an alternative to large group ministry activity, something our church has long been known for, leadership innovatively created opportunities for all willing members to minister to the homeless in their own personal spheres of influence.

Some might imagine that when a church has to shut its doors for more than a month, and reopen to only a small fraction of its previous attendance, that giving would suffer. Quite the opposite was seen as our faithful stewards maintained giving comparable to the gifts received in the prior year.

And, when so often, successful worship is measured only by attendance metrics, our online and in-person worship services have provided an invaluable means of connection with one another as we offer praise to an audience of ONE – our Immeasurable God!

Statistically speaking, a church without a permanent senior pastor at the head for more than a year, should not be thriving. But this is not our church. It is God's. And He has great plans for West Hampton Baptist Church. He graciously sent Bryan Breland for "such a time as this" and we have experienced his unwavering commitment to serve alongside us, pandemic and all, for as long as our church requires an interim pastor.

My dear church family, sometimes updates need only be reminders of the truth we already know. God is good. His is all things for all times and He is always near. Please be encouraged that those serving on your Pastor Search Committee are diligently doing the job you called us to do and that it is your incredible faithfulness that allows us to do the job in a manner than brings glory to God.
