Did you know,

There are many ways to give your tithes and offerings to our church?

You can still give while you are here at church. But what if you are not here, or forgot your checkbook or offering at home and you still want to give?

You can be sure your tithe and offerings are not missed by giving through one of these other ways.

- 1) You could mail your check to the church. It will take a few days to get here and you will need a postage stamp.
- 2) You can go online to your own bank's website and set up a payment to the church, just like you would pay a utility bill. This can even be set up to be done on a reoccurring basis so your offerings will always be received on time even if you are not here. And generally there is no charge for this service to you or the church.
- 3) You can go to our church website (www.whbcnow.org) and give through the SecureGive link with a debit or credit card. This can also be setup on a reoccurring basis.
- 4) You can download the SecureGive App on your smartphone and give with a debit or credit card.
- 5) Lastly, if you are here at church and want to give but only have your debit or credit card with you. You can give at our Giving Kiosk that is mounted to the wall outside of the Sanctuary by just a swipe of your card.

December 8 & 9 January 12 & 13

A Night's Welcome Winter Shelter program for the homeless in Hampton, in which area congregations rotate hospitality providing dinner and breakfast bags to go during the cold winter months. Each group provides meals and assistance for the night at a facility in downtown Hampton, once a month.

Doors open at 6 pm (1 hr earlier) and close at 7 am the next morning. Each guest has a detailed case management intake sheet completed and they are evaluated for additional services. The program currently runs 24 weeks during the coldest winter months, from October through early April.


