Proverbs 18:13 - "Spouting off before listening to the facts is both shameful and foolish."

How many times have we heard something and immediately spouted off based on hearsay rather than seeking out the facts?

When I was in high school, I did this very thing. I heard something was done and said about me and in my foolishness, I ran my mouth without ever going to the person who supposedly said these things and without asking if it was true. 
